New roof, updated auditorium, dedicated music space, upgraded locker rooms and possibly a turf field

Center Moriches Schools to put forth a bond vote

The Center Moriches School District will be proposing a just under \$45 million bond vote for two phases, including major building upgrades as well as a turf football field. The vote will take place on Oct. 24.

"We are really excited for this," said superintendent of schools Dr. Ronald Masera, noting the continued aging of the school buildings, including Clayton Huey Elementary School, the middle school and high school.

The project, according to Keri Loughlin, assistant superintendent for busi-

ness, has a main focus on health and safety, with roof replacement and sidewalk repair. Also part of the proposal is the bus loop construction for 559 Main Street, which was purchased after last year's referendum passed.

This year, the bond will include two propositions:

The first proposition will be for infrastructure including the roof replacement, door replacements, sidewalk repair, new boilers, library upgrades, an auditorium revamp, a dedicated space for the music department and as well as family consumer science classroom upgrades and new locker rooms at both the middle and high schools.

"The lockers are over 50 years old," Masera said. "Sometimes they are unusable, it's so old."

The auditorium, for example, he said has been in extreme disrepair.

"That is exciting, and will strengthen our arts department," he added.

The second proposition is for a new turf field. The district currently uses the nearby Town of Brookhaven turf field, though there are no bleachers. The installation of a turf field, Masera said, provides for a safer and lower-maintenance playing surface for students, in line with most other schools in the region. The new field would include the existing, already replaced lighting as well as new bleachers for viewing and a press box.

"Also, we could host more games at the same time on both turf fields," Loughlin said.

The total cost for the field would be

about \$3.6 million. However, Proposition 2 is contingent on Proposition 1 passing, and cannot pass unless Proposition 1 passes.

"Our neighboring districts, West Hampton and Eastport-South Manor, have [had] major facility upgrades, and our kids deserve the same quality 21st-century learning environment," Masera said, also noting that some residents have choice in which district to send their children. "This is a sizable project for us, but will benefit a generation of Center Moriches students."

However, he said, "on the plus side of it," the district is entitled to 75 percent state aid on any parts of the project that is considered worthy of assistance. "That is less than 25 cents on the dollar

Center Moriches Fire Department plans a revote

Building in need of renovations to meet requirements

The Center Moriches Fire District failed a \$17.9 million bond proposition by slim margins on June 20, with a total of 221 no votes to 201 yes votes. The board has decided to set a revote on Sept. 12 for the original bond proposition that would pay for the renovation and expansion of the department's firehouse. Due to the larger size of modern fire trucks, the present firehouse fails to meet federal and fire industry codes.

If passed, the bond will allow for the renovation and expansion of the department's firehouse, which presently does not have the capacity to accommodate larger trucks required by National Fire Protection Association (NFPA) standards.

The proposal includes a reconstruction of a portion of the facility originally built in 1930, as well as renovations that will bring the overall building into compliance. The apparatus bay built in the '70s is too narrow for firefighters to safely and efficiently dispatch. The '90s-built annex building also requires roof and exterior repairs and is too small for modern fire trucks. In addition, the existing radio room on the ground floor of the main firehouse will be reused to accommodate the 24-hour presence of EMS personnel, who currently lack a dedicated space at the firehouse.

The passage of the bond will increase

Center Moriches Fire District residents' taxes from \$24.188 per \$100 of assessed valuation to \$35.212. This, according to fire department officials, equals less than \$6.50 per week, less than \$1 a day, for a typical home assessed at \$3,000. It also keeps the cost of fire and EMS services well below that of nearby districts such as Coram, Brookhaven/Shirley, Middle Island, and North Patchogue. Fire district taxes make up less than 7.5 percent of the average Center Moriches property tax bill.

We're proposing an expansion, not an entirely new structure," stressed John DeLong, chairman of the board of commissioners. "At less than \$1 a day, this is a very affordable option. And this expansion is needed to protect the community's safety."

The district's fleet of vehicles has expanded from 10 to 19-almost double—including five fire trucks, three ambulances, two fire police vehicles, an advanced life-support first responder, and two rescue boats. The plan will allow for the department to bring their communications system, which is currently in the basement, to the ground level to provide better protection from the threat of flooding.

Additionally, the new space will provide the firefighters with a separate gear storage space, improving conditions by minimizing exposure to carcinogens. The current overcrowding is also a violation of NFPA standards.

Lastly, according to the department,

the renovations and expansion will be less costly than building a new facility. The \$17.9 million bond will be supplemented with \$500,000 in reserve funds, bringing the total project to \$18.4 million. Sandpebble Project Management of Speonk, N.Y., is to serve as construction managers.

"Our volunteers freely give a substantial amount of their time to protect the safety of Center Moriches residents," said commissioner Edward Stypulkowski, "yet, both they and their equipment are crammed into a substandard, undersized, and obsolete firehouse.'

"These essential renovations will bring us into compliance with current fire safety codes and standards," he said. "They'll also help protect the health and safety of our volunteer firefighters and the community at large."



Get involved in the NexTrex challenge

Library seeks to collect 500 pounds in plastic

The Center Moriches Free Public Library has been successful with the NexTrex® Community Recycling Challenge, though they need the community's help to reach their goal of 500 pounds of collected plastics within six

As part of the program, which eventually scores the library a free a high-performance composite bench donated by Trex, library-goers are asked to drop off eligible soft plastics in the corresponding bin, located in the library's corridor near the inside entrance to Hampton Coffee Café.

The sustainability team charged with the efforts includes Christie Matheson, Mary McNulty, Jessica Ceramello, Dominique Nason, and Marcie Litjens, as well as newcomers, Joanne Garofolo, Nadine Livoti, and Lisa Ferguson.


Earlier this year, $\bar{i}n$ April, the original team noticed other libraries participating in the program and they discussed that the program might be a good way to solve and recycle some of the library's plastic waste.

'We had just done our waste audit in April and we had determined that we have plastic ending up in our dumpster that could be recycled by using this program," said library director Litjens, explaining why they decided to join.

The trash audit, done in March, found that one full week of collecting the garbage produced at the library (excluding restrooms) included 83.95 pounds of waste, with 17.6 percent recyclable and

3.3 percent compostable. However, the library only had one glass bottle, which can be attributed to the partnership with the Town of Brookhaven that has provided a glass recycling container on-site. A total of 4,084 patrons visit the library, with an approximate daily average of 510.5 patron visits.

"We receive so many packages and deliveries for everyday operations that are wrapped in plastic, and we never had an avenue to recycle," added Litjens. "This program allows us to prevent this waste from entering a landfill and gives staff and the community a fun and exciting incentive to participate.'

After deciding to begin the program, Matheson took the lead in investigating, contacting the Trex company, and setting up the library as a participant. Once staff was educated on the guidelines for the program, the library began to advertise it to the community. Soon, the collection box started to be filled. Once filled, the team empties, weighs, and delivers to the designated drop-off point, which is the Stop & Shop in Shirley.

"The simplicity of enacting the Nex-Trex Challenge was a key factor in our decision to become a participating organization, in addition to the fact that our coastal communities here on Long Island have a vested interest in keeping plastic pollution out of our oceans and waterways," Matheson said. "Many patrons have stated that they hadn't realized how much plastic film waste they accumulate on a regular basis, until learning about and participating in this program. Researching the initiative was easy, as the program website clearly outlines every step and detail, and collection bins and resources were provided free of charge. Members of our in-house Sustainability Team have been bagging, weighing, logging, and dropping off all donated plastic to be recycled at local corporate partner locations every week. We are so proud of the overwhelming support and participation in this impactful program; the community response has been incredible!"

After two months of collecting, as of June, the library collected 145 pounds of recyclable plastic. By July, four months in, a total of 354 out of 500 pounds was collected, leaving only 146 pounds to reach their goal.

If the goal is met and the bench is donated, Litjens said she is unsure where it would be placed, but the placement would be discussed with the entire team.

WHAT QUALIFIES FOR RECYCLING

Items eligible include: plastic bags, store bags, produce bags, ice bags, Ziploc bags, cereal box liners, case overwrap, bread bags, newspaper sleeves, dry cleaning bags, bubble wrap and plastic e-commerce mailers. Members of the community are asked to bring their eligible plastics, clean and dried, to the library for recycling. Simply drop the items to the drop box. Plastic bags and film packaging should not be recycled in most curbside collections.



Local pens guide for college-bound students

College applications workshop offered to seniors and juniors

Center Moriches resident Trish Portnoy, CPA, MS Ed., has been teaching CTE subjects at West Islip Public Schools since 1997. In 2007. she revamped the curriculum for the

course for College Freshman Seminar and by 2012, over half the graduating class were enrolled as graduating seniors.

Her background in accounting, she said, allowed her to divide large projects into smaller, more understandable components that, combined with her outcome-oriented curriculum, enabled her to structure a course and compose a book: "How to Help Your High School Senior Apply to College."

Her first book, "College Apps: Selecting, Applying to, and Paying for the Right College for You," was a textbook useful to school districts and their students who were interested in offering the course she created.

In 2022, she then published an e-book, booklet/quick-read titled, "How to Help Your High School Senior Apply to College." Why did she write it?

"The magnitude of the student loan debt crisis was caused by a lack of awareness/ education during this critical time, as well as not using data-based decision-making prior to selecting and attending college, she said of her passion to help.

In response to her new book, she will also be hosting "Applying to College with Trish," a 10-week workshop that will assist high school seniors and motivated juniors through the college application process. The group will meet weekly for two hours to review topics related to higher education, college applications, financial aid, and decision-making strategies.

The workshop fee includes 20 hours of small group instruction, plus the College Apps Binder reference sheets and exercises, and the parents' resource, "How to Help Your High School Senior Apply to College."

Her course, she said, intends to reduce stress and anxiety around the college application process for both students and parents. In addition, the workshop activities allow students to have a vested interest and ownership throughout this sometimes-daunting process.

"The course hopes to reduce the potential for a challenging working relationship between parent and child through a detailed structure of organization and time management," she said. "Ultimately, the student, with input from their parents and high school guidance counselor, is the lead on this project."

The workshop runs this fall from September through November for high school iuniors and seniors and again in the spring 2024 for high school juniors only. Locations will vary according to enrollment. To pre-register for the workshop visit www.ApplyingtoCollegewithTrish. com.





On average, less than eight cents of every property tax dollar in Center Moriches goes for fire and EMS services.

Emergency Response

In recent years, there has been a significant increase in fire alarms and ambulance calls. Emergency medical calls have skyrocketed 142 percent between 2010 and 2022. Fire call volume has increased 55 percent over that same period.

Modern Trucks are Larger

The length and height of modern trucks and ambulances have increased significantly. Today's ladder trucks are 29 percent longer and pumpers are 22 percent longer than the early '80s. This expansion would allow us to meet National Fire Protection Association standards.

Safety and Efficiency

The renovations would provide an improved layout and additional apparatus bays. Based upon lessons learned from Superstorm Sandy, the telecom system - now located at basement and ground levels - would be elevated to protect it from the threat of floods or hurricanes.

Taxpayer Impact

The proposed \$17.9-million bond would be supplemented with \$500,000 in reserve funds. The increased fire district taxes would amount to less than one dollar a day for the average home, still lower than many fire districts in our area.

Pinning held for Vietnam vets

Center Moriches VFW Post 414 hosts event

Center Moriches Veterans of Foreign Wars Post 414 and Rep. Andrew Garbarino presented a tribute to Vietnam War veterans on Saturday, Aug. 9.

"It is my privilege to [give] these lapel $\[$ pins to our veterans," Garbarino said.

Memorial lapel pins and official certificates were distributed to military veterans, as well as the families of deceased veterans. The ceremony was offered as part of the United States of America Vietnam War Commemoration program. The tribute serves to remind the public of the sacrifices made during the Vietnam War nearly five decades ago.

'[Garbarino] partnered with the United Sates of America Vietnam War Commemoration to host this pinning because [he wants] to honor those Vietnam veterans that call [his] Second Congressional District home and make sure they know they have the thanks of a grateful nation," a statement released by Garbarino's communications director Kristen Cianci read.

Attendees assembled before 11 a.m. inside VFW Post 414's gathering hall, on Main Street in Center Moriches. Veterans and their families were seated at tables inside the hall by VFW Post 414 and local service organizations such as Boy Scout troops. Garbarino officially began the ceremony at 11 a.m. with a speech. Col. William Stratemeier spoke after Garbarino finished.

"As a member of Congress, being able to honor veterans for their service is an honor," Garbarino said. "I am committed to fighting for them in Congress... I will always stand by our veterans."

"Vietnam was a very difficult time in American history," Stratemeier said. "We need to do everything to honor and protect our [dying] veterans. Our vets did not return to a hero's welcome... they were labeled baby killers.'

Names of veterans, living and dead, were read off a list after Stratemeier ended his speech. Surviving veterans were invited to step forward and receive the lapel pins, along with certificates from Garbarino and the organizers of the event. If a named veteran was deceased, surviving family members could claim the pins and certificates in their stead. Lucy Rivera accepted a pin and certificate for her husband, who died in 2021 on Veterans Day.

"[My husband] belonged to the 12th Tactical Fighter Wing," Rivera said.

Garbarino said his father and grandfather were also military veterans. VFW Post 414's own commander, Robert Galbraith, is a Vietnam veteran. He had been serving in Germany when the armed forces ordered him to transfer to the Vietnam campaigns.

"I was assigned to the 4th Infantry Division—that was an artillery unit,"

Galbraith said. "I spent six months out in the field, and I drove in convoys. They would put a battery of infantry and artillery at the top of a mountain [in order to create] a firebase. I'm 100 percent disabled because of Agent Orange, like so many veterans.'

The final lapel pin and certificate recipients received their honors almost exactly at noon. Event attendees were then invited to partake in refreshments, including wraps and beverages.

"We had vets come from Northport VA in a bus," event attendee Miriam Gillies said. "We used to have dinners for them.'

VFW Post 414 has hosted other ceremonies honoring veterans in the past, along with events designed to support the Moriches community. The post currently plans to host a health screening event in September and a Halloween dance.

"All the tables were filled [for the pinning]," Galbraith said. ■

Fun at the fluke fishing tournament

Great Gun Moriches Anglers hosts annual vent

The Great Gun Moriches Anglers hosted their annual fluke fishing tournament at the Union Avenue dock in Center Moriches on Saturday, Aug. 5.

'We've got it down, how to handle a tournament properly," Great Gun Moriches Anglers member Frank Lap-

The Chet Wilcox Memorial Fluke Tournament lasted from 6 a.m. until 5 p.m. Anglers sailed into Moriches Bay and surrounding waters in order to catch the largest fluke possible. Each of the anglers who caught the three largest fish was awarded a cash prize. The Great Gun Moriches Anglers hope that the fishing tournament helps the Center Moriches area become more aware of the local fishing community.

'We wanted to bring a local tournament to the forefront of our community [and promote] Moriches Bay's most popular fishery," Great Gun Moriches Anglers vice president John Bunai said.

The Great Gun Moriches Anglers posted flyers advertising the fluke fishing tournament. The flyers displayed the tournament's official rules and the prizes. Participants signed up at Harts Cove Bait & Tackle, in East Moriches, and Sharks Bait & Tackle, in Mastic.

Originally, prizes were based on the assumption that 100 anglers would register for the tournament. Finishing in first place had a cash prize of \$1,875; second place's reward was \$1,125; and third place's prize was \$750. On the morning



of the tournament, around 50 anglers had registered, so the first-place prize was changed to \$935, second place's prize was altered to \$560, and third place's prize became \$380.

"In the interest of promoting conservation, our minimum size [for a fish] to be eligible for a prize is 21 and 1/2 inches," Bunai said. "A legal-sized fluke to keep is 18 and 1/2 inches in New York State.'

For the past two decades, the fluke tournament was originally known as the Moriches Anglers Fluke Tournament. However, the tournament was renamed this year in honor of Chet Wilcox. Wilcox had owned B & B Tackle and Sports in Center Moriches. He died in May 2022.

"He was a local legend [and] very active in the community," Great Gun Moriches Anglers member Tim Markart said. "[He was] just an overall good man [and] good person."

"He was considered a talent in his family, [who] were big duck farmers," Bunai said.

"He was a mentor to everyone who fished here," Lapinski said. "He was the only guy back [in the day] who advertised freshwater tackle."

Additional competitors entered the tournament at the last moment by signing up at the Union Avenue dock around 6 a.m. the day of the tournament. Fishermen spent the next 10 hours scouring local waters, like Moriches Bay, for fluke. The Great Gun Moriches Anglers started weighing submitted fish at the dock at 4 p.m. All tournament participants were expected to return to the dock by 4:30 p.m., so that all fish could be properly evaluated by 5 p.m.

The judging of the fishes, known as the "weigh-in" among the anglers, was accompanied by a barbecue. Hamburgers and hot dogs were offered to fishermen returning from their 10-hour quest for the largest fluke. The Great Gun Moriches Anglers also sold T-shirts to tournament attendees in order to spread awareness of the club. Russel Werthner won first-place prize of \$935 with a fish that was 24 and 3/4 inches and weighed 5.65 pounds, while Tom Kaucky won second place with a fish that was 22 and 1/2 inches long and weighed 4.15 pounds. As Werthner and Kaucky's fluke were the only submitted fish that fulfilled the length requirement of 21 and 1/2 inches, third-place's cash prize was raffled off and given to a random tournament par-

"Ī've won a few [tournaments] so far in my time," Werthner said, "so it felt really good [to win], especially with a 5-pounder. [There] was one [fish] we didn't think would make it in, but we had three keepers."

The Great Gun Moriches Anglers desire to continue hosting the tournament annually in order to both strengthen their ties to the community and to honor Chet Wilcox. Their next event will be a striped bass tournament at the end of October. The tournament is currently planned to start Oct. 25 and end on Oct.

"That wraps up [our] stuff for the year," Great Gun Moriches Anglers president Evan Goldstein said.

Lapinski added that the Great Gun Moriches Anglers is planning to create a Chet Wilcox Youth Tournament for local youth. The club is still drafting plans for the youth tournament and has not yet announced a potential date for the new event.

ESM football looking for improvement this season

Varsity team gets new head football coach

Eastport-South Manor has a new head football coach, and he's looking to turn around a program that went 2-6 last season.

"Improvise, overcome, and adapt has kind of been our motto," coach Chris Prokesch said during the recent Media Day for Conference III teams.

The Sharks, a ninth seed going into the season, have faced their share of challenges. They lost access to their weight room while the high school is being renovated, and have had to find a place to practice while their practice field is being converted from grass to synthetic turf, said Prokesch, who has been with the program for 11 years, mostly as offensive and defensive line coach.

There are plenty of reasons for optimism, according to Prokesch, who was interim coach in 2018, the last season the Sharks posted a winning record.

The roster is deeper—about 40 players compared to about 25 last seasonwith more seniors, including more in the starting lineup.

"We're going to be a lot more experienced and have a lot more manpower on our roster," Prokesch said.

Talk to the Sharks' tight-knit core of seniors and you can feel how much they've made it their mission to finish their high school careers on a high note.

"For the guys who are seniors, we have a lot of motivation for the season," said tight end John Izzo. "We don't want

to end on a bad note. We're leaving. We want to end with a bang. We're not trying to lose. We're going to win. We're going to dedicate ourselves to practice. We're going to work hard and put everything we have into it."

The Sharks return four offensive line-

men, including senior Matt Pompei. They'll be called upon to protect sophomore quarterback Max Ferraro and open holes for Daniel Odell, who will be the primary running back.

Pompei said he and the other seniors have been working to motivate the underclassmen.

"We're very confident in how we're going to perform this season," he said.

The Sharks open the season with road games at Amityville on Sept. 1 and Kings Park on Sept. 13. Their home opener is Sept. 23 against Rocky Point. ■





ESM student places at Quarterback Challenge



taxpayers have to pay to get the work done.'

The work will most likely be done in phases over the course of three to four years, spreading the costs and making the cost to taxpayers "more palatable," Loughlin said.

Also, the board, Masera said, is considering utilizing the capital reserve to offset some of the costs in the amount of about \$1.5 million. However, to utilize that funding would also require a referendum vote.

The project has been created by a committee comprising over 20 community members, including a diverse crowd of administration, teachers and residents, with students and without. The first presentation was held in late June.

In 2020, the district approved an Energy Performance Project at no cost to the taxpayer. The self-funding project implemented energy savings by adding solar among other additions, including

updated lighting throughout the district, univents and film on windows. That project was a total of \$6 million.

Also, the district passed a bond in 2015 in the amount of \$8 million for roof work at Clayton Huey, door replacement, security cameras and science labs.


Following a yearlong development process, the Center Moriches School District Board of Education approved a resolution at its July 5 meeting to move forward with a proposed bond project and scheduled a community vote on the proposition for Oct. 24, 2023.

The board held a presentation on Aug. 30 during their regular board meeting to go over what was included in the project, though numbers on increases to the taxpayer were not available as of press time. Several other meetings will be held throughout September to October ahead of the vote. The district's website includes additional information. ■





All about lavender

We cancelled our walking tour of Connetquot Park last month and replaced it with a presentation by Deb Cannarelli, all about lavender.

Lavender dates back 2500 years, mostly found in the Mid-East but also in Spain, Portugal and Croatia. We are most familiar with lavendula augustifolia, or English lavender.

Oddly enough, it doesn't originate in England but in the Mediterranean, and is the lavender you would find in Provence, France. For us, this lavender is great because it likes full sun, alkaline, and sandy soil with good drainage.

You can buy it or propagate from cuttings. Trim it down after the first bloom and you'll get a respectable second bloom. It is great for hedges (grows up to 24 inches) and is lovely in rock gardens and herb gardens. You can dry it and make little sachet packets to put in your closet.

Best of all, it is rabbit and deer resistant, and butterflies love it. Some say it repels mosquitoes and moths. It comes in white, blue, violet, pink and of course, lavender. Consider it for your




